

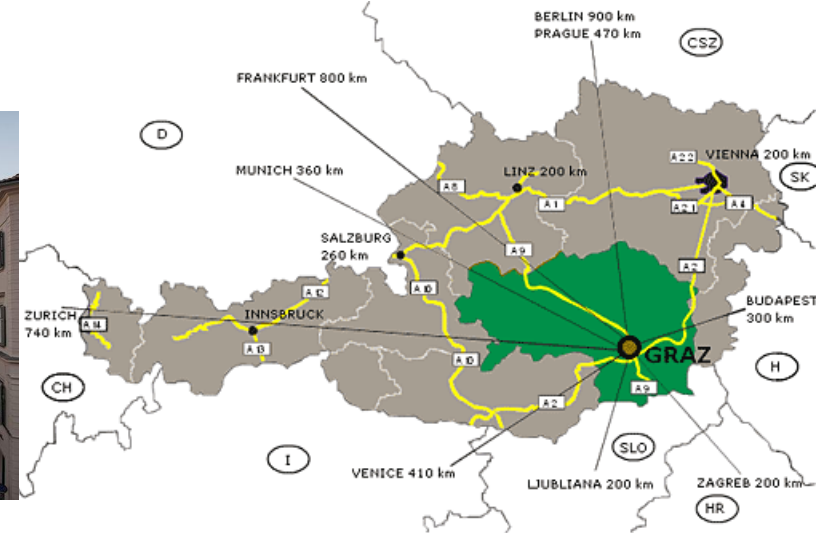

- 300.000 inhabitants
- 60.000 students
- Middle aged city center is UNESCO World Heritage
- Active modern architecture scene



How to get to Graz?

Airplane

- Regular flights from mayor international hubs
 - Germany: Frankfurt, Munich, Duesseldorf, Hamburg
 - Austria: Vienna
 - Switzerland: Zurich



Train

- Direct train connections to many European cities
 - Austria: Vienna, Salzburg, Innsbruck
 - Germany: Munich, Stuttgart, Berlin
 - Czech Republic: Prague
 - Poland: Warsaw
 - Switzerland: Zurich
 - Italy (with one change): Rome, Milano, Venice

Wide range of hotels

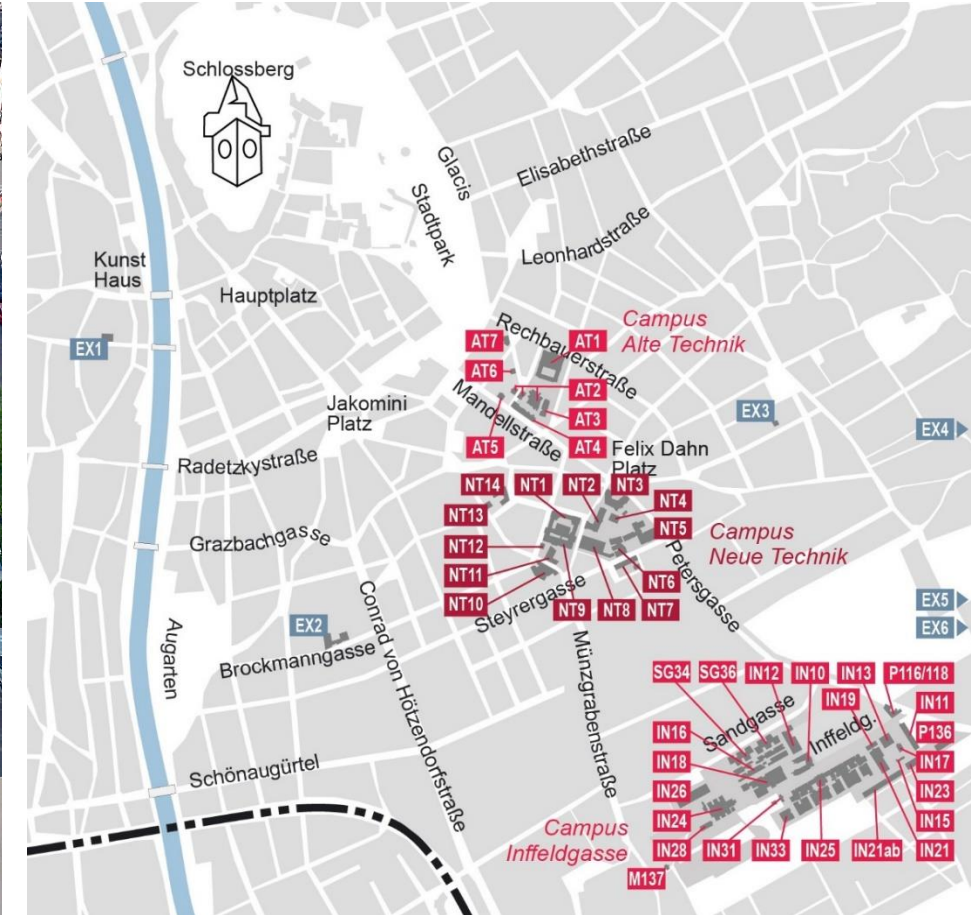
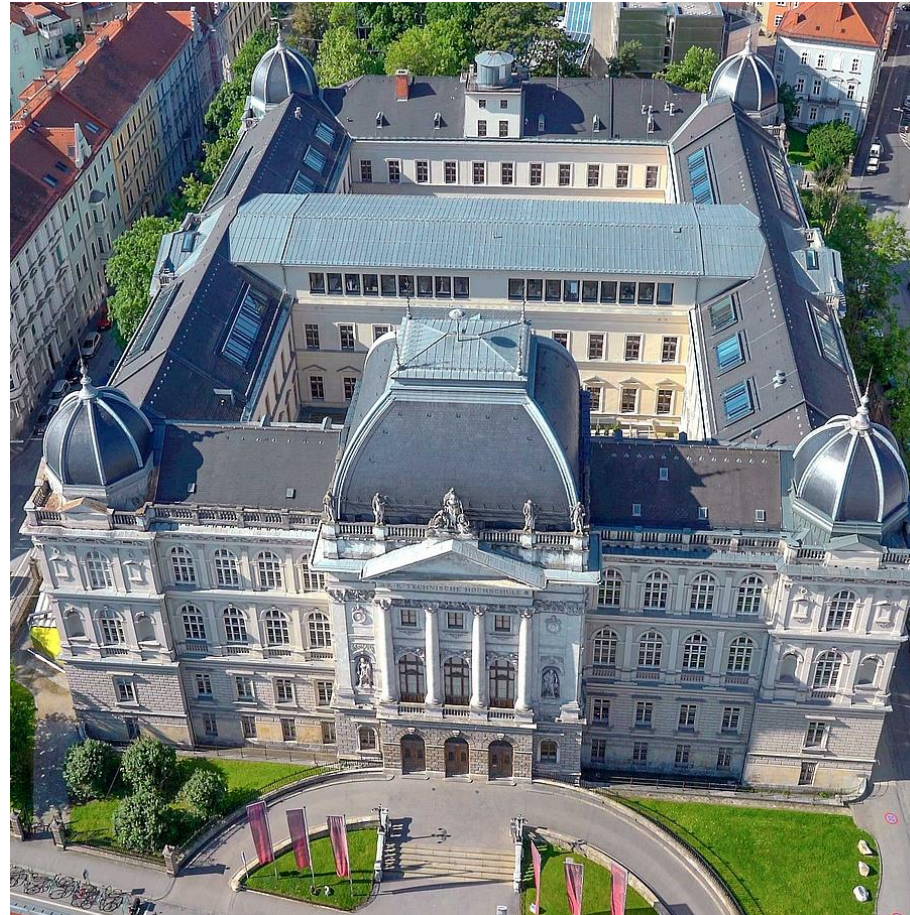
- 3 and 4 Star hotels at moderate prices (typically 90 – 180 €/night)

 - Walking distance to all sights
 - 6 minutes by tram to university
 - 15 – 20 minutes walk to university

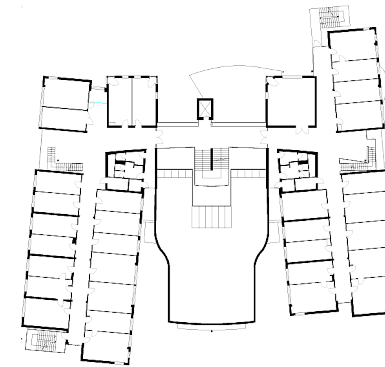
- Founded in 1811

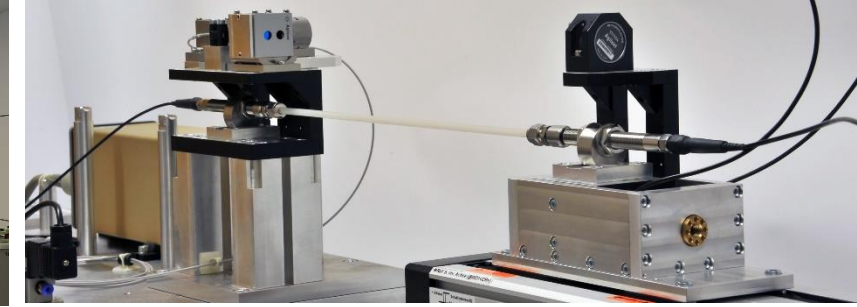
- Located at TU Graz Campus Neue Technik
